

GUIDELINES FOR STUDENT UNIFORM – SENIOR SCHOOL

The Macquarie uniform is smart and distinctive. The way that students wear their uniform is a powerful statement about their personal standards and by inference also a symbol of our school's corporate standards and aspirations. It is expected that students will wear their uniform with pride and distinction at all times.

Parents are urged to support our uniform policy by purchasing the correct uniform items and by ensuring that students come to school each day in full school uniform.

All uniform items should be neat, clean and in good repair. Students are expected to travel to and from school in their correct school uniform, regardless of whether they are using public or private transport.

Below is the current list of uniform items:

Summer Uniform

Senior Girls

- Navy skirt (length mid knee)
- White short sleeved shirt
- Navy tie (different tie for Years 11 and 12)
- White crew socks (just above ankle)
- Black lace up shoes*
- Macquarie bucket hat
- Blazer to be worn for all assemblies and formal occasions

Senior Boys

- Grey Senior School shorts or trousers
- White short sleeved shirt
- School tie (different tie for Years 11 and 12)
- School grey socks
- Black lace up shoes*
- Macquarie bucket hat
- Blazer to be worn for all assemblies and formal occasions

*Shoes should be a black leather (not suede or boot), neatly polished lace up shoe with a flat heel. Black leather joggers are not acceptable.



Summer Sport Uniform

- Macquarie sport polo shirt (not required to be tucked in)
- Macquarie sport shorts
- Plain white socks (no logos) or Macquarie school sport socks
- Lace up sports shoes
- Macquarie bucket hat

Winter Uniform

Senior Girls

- Tartan school skirt (length mid knee)
- White long-sleeved or short-sleeved shirt
- Navy tie
- Navy school jumper with crest
- Macquarie anorak
- Navy 70 denier tights or knee high socks (no gaps between socks and skirt)
- Black lace up school shoes*
- Macquarie bucket hat
- Macquarie navy long pants (optional)
- Blazer to be worn for all assemblies and formal occasions.

Senior Boys

- Grey senior school long pants
- White long sleeved or short sleeved shirt
- Macquarie school tie
- Macquarie anorak
- Navy school jumper with crest
- Macquarie grey socks
- Black lace up shoes*
- Macquarie bucket hat
- Plain navy glove (optional)
- Macquarie beanie (optional)
- Blazer to be worn for all assemblies and formal occasions

*Shoes should be a black leather (not suede or boot), neatly polished lace up shoe with a flat heel. Black leather joggers are not acceptable.

Note: The school will provide senior students with the formal girls' 'Natasha' wide brim school hat and boys' 'Akubra' wide brim school hat when representing the school in the community or on formal occasions such as ANZAC day and youth leadership conferences.

Winter Sport Uniform

- Macquarie sport polo shirt (not required to be tucked in)
- Macquarie sport tracksuit (jacket and pants)
- Macquarie rugby jumper
- Plain white socks (no logos) or Macquarie school sport socks
- Macquarie bucket hat

Uniform Expectations

- 1. All clothing should be of a modest fit. For both female students, skirt hems are mid knee length.
- 2. Boys' shirts are to be tucked in with all buttons done up. Ties are to be neatly tied with the length to the top of the waistband. Ties are only to be removed and top buttons undone on advice of the Principal or delegate.
- 3. The school jumper is to be worn with formal school uniform only. This means that students are not permitted to wear the jumper with their sport uniform. The rugby jumper and jacket are only to be worn with the sports uniform. (The only exception is the Year 12 rugby jumper. This is not to be worn on formal occasions).
- 4. Shoes should be black leather (not suede or boot), lace up school shoe with a flat heel. Black leather joggers are not acceptable.
- 5. Sport shoes are those designed for running and outdoor exercise activities. They should only be worn on sport days. Slipper style shoes and hi-top sneakers are not permitted.
- 6. Students should maintain a high standard of personal hygiene and grooming at all times.
- 7. Boys' hair is to be no longer than the top edge of the collar. Hair should be neatly cut and groomed. Hair colouring and hair styles that attract undue attention are not permitted. e.g. rat's tail, mullets and or shavings. Hairstyles are not to restrict a student's vision. Please note that the final decision on hair suitability will rest with the Principal or delegate. Stage 6 boys have the option of wearing their hair in a bun.
- 8. Girls' hair, shoulder length or longer, is to be tied up neatly. Year 12 girls may wear their hair out. Only white, navy, green, red or gold hair accessories are allowed. Hair colouring that attracts undue attention is not permitted. Hairstyles are not to restrict a student's vision. Please note that the final decision on hair suitability will rest with the Principal or delegate.
- g. Male students should be clean shaven at all times.
- 10. Coloured fingernail polish or fake nails are not allowed. Students with coloured nail polish will be asked to remove it.
- 11. Jewellery that is permitted is: one watch, sleepers, small pearl or plain gold or silver stud (one earring per ear, in the lower lobe). Students are not able to cover earrings, wear clear earrings or tape over earrings. Years 11 and 12 students are also allowed one plain fine ring, necklace and bracelet (no gem stones or charms). Boys are not to wear piercings of any description.
- 12. Make up that attracts undue attention is not permitted. Please note that the final decision on make-up suitability will rest with the Principal or delegate.
- 13. Undergarments such as singlet tops should be flesh colour or white. Such garments should not be visible when wearing uniform.
- 14. The appropriate school hat should be worn whenever students are outdoors.
- 15. The school sport uniform may be worn to and from school on the weekly Sport Day and on day(s) when a student has a practical PDHPE lesson. If students have a practical PE lesson on a formal assembly day, students must wear their formal uniform and change for their lesson.
- 16. On 'Casual clothes days' students are permitted to wear non-uniform clothing and will be given clear guidelines regarding appropriate attire. They are at no time to wear singlet tops, crop tops, clothing with offensive slogans/ images, or open shoes (including Crocs) as part of their attire on these days. Leggings/tights with a long shirt or jumper (to mid-thigh) are permitted.
- 17. If for a valid reason (please see below) a student is unable to wear their full uniform, parents/ caregiver is to email their Tutor teacher or Deputy. Students will not be permitted to come to school out of uniform for long periods of time and we will work with families to assist with uniform where possible.

Senior School Uniform Monitoring

As outlined above there are clear expectations regarding uniform at Macquarie. If a student chooses to wear the uniform incorrectly on any given day they will be first spoken to regarding the nature of the uniform breach, which will then be recorded in Edumate by their Tutor.

Please note all uniform indiscretions will be noted on Edumate, visible through the parent portal. Students will receive a lunchtime detention for a uniform infringement. Three infringements in any given term result in an After School Detention. Parents will be notified via email. If these infringements continue parents may be required to meet with the Head of School or delegate.

Note: Sport uniform is considered incorrect if worn on a day in which the student does not attend timetabled PDHPE or sport lessons.
